Mr. SUMNERS of Texas introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To penalize the divulging of the contents of confidential Government documents.

- 1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
- 2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
- 3 That whoever, without authority, shall willfully and know-
- 4 ingly furnish, communicate, divulge, or publish to any person,
- 5 in whole or in part, copies or the contents, substance, purport,
- 6 effect, or meaning of any file, instrument, letter, memoran-
- 7 dum, book, pamphlet, paper, document, manuscript, map,
- 8 picture, plan, record, or other writing in the custody of the
- 9 United States, or of any agency, officer, or employee thereof,
- 10 declared to be secret or confidential by statute, or declared
- 11 to be secret or confidential by any rule or regulation of any

1 department or agency of the United States of which he has
2 knowledge or which has been published in the Code of
3 Federal Regulations or in the Federal Register, shall be fined
4 not more than \$5,000 or imprisoned for not more than two
5 years, or both. The provisions of this section are in addition
6 to, and do not supersede, other laws.

7 SEC. 2. The head of any executive department, inde-
8 pendent establishment, or other agency may authorize the
9 disclosure of information not declared to be secret or confi-
10 dential by statute in the custody of his department, establish-
11 ment, or agency to particular persons or classes of persons
12 or to the public generally. The provisions of section 1 of
13 this Act shall not apply to disclosures so authorized.
