Security of Special Gos-Filled Cabls

- 1. Reference is made to your verbel request for information regarding the security of special gen-filled telephone cables.
- 2. In a conversation with Mr. Rem Schmidt, Research Freducts Company, Bambury, Connecticut, and with Mr. Alex Prengle, Chief, Foreign Security Section, Bepertment of State, on 12 October 1949, it was learned that Mr. Schmidt had personally, physically tapped a gas-filled cable similar to the one used by the Army Security Agency. Wr. Schmidt's efforts were in connection with the installation of gas-filled cable at Hyde Park for President Receivedt. It took him some tem or fifteen minutes to accomplish the physical tap. He stated that, as a result, it was erdered that the President's special cable be patrolled when in use by him. Mr. Schmidt has also inductively tapped lead-covered cable similar in its inductive shielding to our gas-filled cable, and insists that an inductive tap against our gas-filled cable would be successful.
- 3. As a point of further interest, Wr. Frengle explained a method of opening the latest pick-proof three-combination look being sold by Greenleef and Whittier. According to him a supersonic oscillator and special oscilloscopic receiver are being developed to permit "probing" the inner disks with supersonic waves, to provide a "picture" of the disks which reveals where the slots are located.
