(3) The officer signing the original certificate cannot be held solely responsible for the contents of the package or packages once they have been transferred to an official custodian of cryptomaterial other than the one originally signing for the package or packages. Transferring these packages from one warehouse to another, or after a number of years, to the ultimate halder, may expose these packages to surreptitious entry so that when the packages are eventually opened, the contents will not jibe with the original transfer report or certificate. Thus, the certifying officer retains responsibility only for having seen the machine inserted in the box and checking the numbers on the outside of the scaled container.
