



The writer was directed to proceed to UNIS-6 (Nerso Air Daso) and UNIS-32 (Chayern) or other locations to further instigate a search for Greek Guerrilla targets, endeavor to intercept traffic, establish call signs, frequencies and schedules. This ossignment and others subsequently added are discussed in the order in which the duties were performed.
 - a. The first location colected for this mission was USA-6 at Herso Air Hase. Intercept positions were available, rhombic antennas could be used and a search section could be utilised in the event good results were obtained.




