M/R: On 6 Jan 61, a conference was held with representatives of the
Air Force and they were verbally advised that SEC would be turning over
security responsibility for Project 466L and its sub-projects to the Air
Force. During this conference, it was agreed that SEC would provide the
Air Force with written confirmation of this fact. Said confirmation was
provided by NSA ltr Serial No. 0296, dtd 17 Jan 61. On 24 Jan 61, SEC
transferred to Maj James Johnson, AFCIN-1C, the security clearance forms
for all pending Air Force contractor clearances relating to Project 466L
and its sub-projects. On 21 Feb 61, SEC turned over to Maj Johnson the
Standard Practice Procedures for the IBM facility, Bethesda, Md and for
Project AN/GLR-1, Stromberg-Carlson Co, Rochester, N. Y. Representatives
of SEC have been in frequent contact with AFCIN and SPO representatives
in an effort to effect an efficient, orderly and rapid security transition
of these projects. The Air Force presently estimates that SSO's (one for
Washington, D. C. and one for Calif.) can be made available on/about
15 Jun 61. SEC will take action before that date to debrief those con-
tractor personnel who are presently indoctrinated. The Air Force will
re-indoctrinate these people immediately following the SEC debriefing.
As soon as the SSO's are made available, the required document transfer
will be accomplished. SEC will attempt to effect the document transfer
as soon as possible. Close liaison will be maintained with the Air Force
in an effort to complete the transfer action as rapidly and efficiently
as possible.
