- l. Pursuant to the decision of USCIB at its 79th seeting, the Ad Hoc Committee proceeded to work out an agreed U.S. view as to the assignment of the various systems and classes of COMINT to the new categories which would be established by the revision of Appendix B, BRUSA (Reference C.)
- 2. The Ad Hoc Committee has completed this task by producing a categorization of the various systems and classes of COMINT as Exhibit 1 for attachment to the proposed revision of Appendix B, BRUSA. The Ad Hoc Committee has agreed unanimously on categorization and presents it to the Board for approval. Exhibit 1 is attached hereto as Enclosure A.
- 3. In the course of the long and complex discussions which led to ultimate unanimity on the form and content of Exhibit 1, it became apparent that categorization alone could not provide a complete solution to the utilization



problem. The Committee, therefore, undertook the study of utilization with specific reference to the handling of certain internal and international plain texts. Unanimous agreement was also reached in devising a plan for a broader use of such texts within the proposed system of categories. It was plain, however, that this plan could not form a part of the Exhibit but belonged, rather, within Appendix B itself as approved by USCIB at the 79th meeting. The Committee, therefore, has agreed unanimously on a further revision of paragraphs 29f and 29h of Revised Appendix B. This further revision is attached herewith as Enclosure B.

The Ad Hoc Committee recommends that:

- a. The Board approve Enclosures A and B.
- b. That draft Appendix B, as now further revised, and Exhibit 1 thereto be forwarded for information and comment to the Chairman, LSIB.

- c. That the operations of the Ad Hoc Committee be terminated forthwith.

## Exhibit 1

In accordance with the definition of each category described in Appendix B, COMINT material will be categorised as follows:

## I. Category I.

- A. D/F fixes and bearings, provided that no interpretations of changing call sign systems are included.
- B. Tactical, plain text traffic provided that no interpretations of changing call sign systems, enciphered map references, or results of advanced traffic analysis are included. At present, this material includes:
  - 1. Local procedural and local grid and zone systems used for artillery direction; tactical control and movement of front line units; and early warning and exercise of tactical combat control of aircraft.
- C. Crypt-intelligence from analysis of radar tracking and visual observation reports as found in plain language tactical traffic. These will include grid or zone values and procedural codes used for
