#HBJACT: Demonstration of the ASAM #-1

1. On 26 Harch I demonstrated the ASAN 2-1 to Mr. deVocjold and Mr. Doussons of the French Embassy, as a result of the agreement reached by USCIB to land 5 of those machines to the French.

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- A. I explained the equipment in considerable detail and demonstrated its operation under DAPERS procedure, stressing the point that accurity to be obtained from this machine depended on the strictcut adherence to correct operating procedures. I would say that the French were quite impressed and very pleased.
- 3. After the demonstration and my ensuring several questions which the French raised, we discussed some of the administrative points involved. I repeated that the equipments would be furnished them on an indefinite free loan basis as would a supply of spare parts. I told them that we would sither provide them with wired rotors and finished hay material or would give them blank rotors with wiring instructions and specifications for making the DAFHEE material. Their ensure to this was the chvious one, that they would prefer the blanks and the instructions rather than the finished key material.
- 4. I then asked them when and where they would want delivery. They informed me that they were uncertain of this at the present time but would let Mr. Dulles know in two course. They said that what they were going to recommend would be that one or two of the equipments remain in Washington and that the first use of the equipments be on the Mushington-Paris circuit. They also said that they had recommonded to the foreign Office that an engineer-maintenance ann be sont to Mashington to receive some instruction which he could subsequently past on to others (this was in busping with the suggestion made by Mr. Dollos proviously, as the result of the aide manoiro which General Coning had sent him). I told them that we would be able to arrange such training and that Mr. devosjoli should inform Mr. Dulles when their was would be here. In this connection it is important to note that although the arrangements for the engineering and maintenance instruction would be made by CIA, it would be up to MSA to supply the instruction. When this occurs, if it does, the personnel doing the instruction should first receive careful guidance from MEA-41 in order to avoid inadvertent discussions of some of the recent work which we have done in modifying the ASAM R-1 and the 13122 (particularly as regards redistion).

- 5. At no time in the course of these discussions did I mention the ASAM R-1 medification. However, as a result of instructions from the Combined Working Group of USCIB, I intend to discuss the medification with the French in Paris, provided the British raise so objections (the UK has already been asked on this point). Also in Paris, I will provide the appropriate authorities with the retor wiring and may list specifications referred to above.
