"The CHAINTAN pointed out to Mr. Fackard the following general principles which be thought should be used as guidance in the writing of a revised Security Committee report:

- "A. Increase the security of COMIST by reducing the manber of pe sons who bendle material in the high-set enterpry.
- "h. Explore the possibility of increasing the production of COUNT by relaxing, to some extent, the electronic standards for personnal who handle material in the lower categories.
- "g. If possible, without scerifising security, broaden the usefulness of plain text COUNT by allowing more latitude in its dissemination.
- *d. Determine the mecessity for the adoption of more than two or three categories.
- "a. To insure the proper entegorisation of individual messages, and to minimize the loss of valuable information, devise, if possible, a standard template to be used by personnel charged with the responsibility of sorting COMM natural into estagories.
- "f. Determine the feasibility of adopting new principles to increase the security of COMMIT."
