- 1. I have made a few marks on the enclosure, but they are probably not very enlightening.
- 2. In general, I would prefer to see the USCIB Committee deal only with the general problem of dissemination of COMINT product, leaving AFSA free to institute in a more closely held manner such measures as may be necessary with respect to disguising the product of any success against high-level systems, and limiting the dissemination thereof, when the need for such measures is more imminent and their nature can be more clearly determined. Paragraph 3 of the draft, for example, is, in my opinion, exactly the sort of information that should not get about, yet if the USCIB Security Committee is required to investigate the matter as set forth in the proposed draft, this, and much more, must be brought out in the open.
- 3. If you don't have to proceed in a hurry, should like to talk it over with you and the others.
