[ I delayed sending the papers 24 hours in order to give them a final cheoking, for the purpose of being sure.

These papers should enable Major Yardley to demonstrate to Colonel Mauborgne that the new method of using the Machine is not as good as the old. May I suggest that Major Yardley notifies Colonel Mauborgne immediately on his return to Kashington to withhold his report to the Chief of the Signal Corps until he has studied the enclosed as $I$ feel it might save him some embarrassment.]
