SUBJECT: Recommendations of MGASAB in Regard to Deputy Director for Research and Development

- I. As Executive Secretary of the Agenty's Scientific advisory Board, I sat with the members for several hours on 5 February in their discussions of the various nominees we had listed as nominees for the position of Deputy Director for Research and Development. This memorandum reports the results thereof.
- 2. Eighteen somisees were eliminated as unsultable; the remaining masses were elassified in three categories in accordance with the Board's estimate of preference. Attached hereto is the complete list abouing the masses which were eliminated and the estegories in which the remaining masses were placed.
- 3. The Board decided to concentrate on Category I at this equion and concluded its deliberations by listing the nominees in that entegory in the order is which they should be approached:

- is Dr. Mokes was the smanispus choice for leading candidate, and it was the consensus that if MDA could berrow him for 15 mentis or two years from the Ball Telephone Laboratories, where he is now Yice President in sharge of all development, we would have the very heat man in the country for the job. I telephoned Dr. Ralph Potter this merming to ascertain his personal spinion as to Dr. McRae's qualifications for the job and ressived a most enthusiastic recumendation. Dr. Petter thought that we might have a chance of getting Dr. McRae if an approach were made on the highest level. Incidentally, Dr. McRae was not on the list sabmitted by CIA.
- 5. You will note that Dr. Stratton and Dr. Suits were tied as possibilities for the next choice of the Board; they could not differentiate between the two of them as to suitability for the job. They therefore put both of them in group 2, after McRas. The same applied to Dr. Hill and Dr. Wiesner, who were third choices.
- 6. I am collecting biographical information on all five names listed above and shall present the data to you as soon as possible. I have also initiated the necessary requests for ascartaining cheerability of these conditates.

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- 7. The Board recommends the following steps as regards making an approach:
 - A. Assertain elearance status or clearability of each of the each dates.
 - b. If cleared or electable, invite the candidate to Washington, "above him the works," and try to get him interested safficiently to want to undertake the job for a year or two.
 - : 4. If he proves to be intersected, make an approach, on the highest level, to the head of the corporation or institution involved, with a request that the number be lossed to as for a period of 18 to 24 months.
- 8. If we are not successful in getting any of the sen in Category I, we will then proceed to study Category II.
