I have devoted considerable time to studying the opecial Commuications Advisory Group (CCAG) Report which was submitted to se on 17 March 1952 and which I found not only quite interesting but also VEFY until.

The five principal recommendations made in the Report have been given special attention and I have directed that these recommendations or parts of them which can be carried out as matters entirely within my responsibility are to be implemented without delay and to the maximum practicable degree.

I was favorably impressed with the recommendation that a separate research organization be established within this Agency and have directed that a datailed plan and program for its establishment and operation be prepared for no by a special group in this Agency, assisted by Dr. Regatrom and Dr. Potter. I trust that it will be possible to consult with you on various aspects of the plan after it has been elaborated.

In My epinion the principal purpose for which was assembled has been suggestilly accomplished. That purpose was to look into one of the most important problems before this Agency, to render an opinion as to Whether we are employing our resources to best advantage on the problem, and to recommend further action or steps which might haven the solution. I feel confident that the recommendations contained in the SCAG Report will be conductive to that end.

Aside from the foregoing, another important purpose was to acquaint certain top-flight mathematicians and electronics engineers with our work and to evoke their interest in it so that we might call individually upon them for occasional advice or essistance on certain aspects of our problems. I believe that this secondary aim has also been escosplished.
