MEHCRAHDUN FOR MR. GRANT HANSON:

SUBJECT: Brist History of U. S. CONTRY Activities

- 1. Herewith as requested is a very condensed history of the Communications Intelligence (COMINT) activities of the U. N.
 - 2. It is advisable that I call your attention to the following:
- a. This history has no standing as an official decement, although I believe the information it contains is authentic.
- b. If the story about the Navy's CCHINT organization and setivities appears rather seager in comparison with that about the Army's, please bear in sind (1) that there is, so far as I have been able to ascertain, no efficial Eavy history of that organization or of its activities, so that I sould consult no official documents or documented sources; and that (2) the activities and results of the Navy's CCHINT organization and operations were kept highly secret even within the Havy and were a more or less completely closed book to the Army until about 1937, so that my personal knowledge of or very occasional contacts with them hardly afford a good basis for writing authentic history. The only document I was able to find was an informal and unofficial, very brief history, prepared in draft form by Capt. L. F. Safford, USH, who was Chief of the Eavy's CCHINT organization from 5 Kay 1936 until 1h Pebruary 1942. Capt. Safford wrote his draft history in Hovember 1943, but carried the story only up to 7 Descaper 1941.
- e. If I had been given more time, this history might be shorter, or at least it would be more complete, for it would be strange if a few facts pertinent to the history were not omitted as a result of the pressure under which it was written.
- 3. One such emission now noted is that dealing with the activities of the cryptummitation unit of the U. S. Const Courd during the days of the machine experiment." In 1925 the Coast Courd established a small unit in tenhington, headed by Mrs. Friedman and consisting of about half desen persons, to solve radio traffic of the run-runners operating in U. S. Coastal auters. The Coast Guard built up an excellent intercept service for this purpose. The intercept service and the cryptumalytic unit con-

tinued to operate even after 1933, working on the traffic of other illicit operations, chiefly those of narcotics amugglers. Shortly after Pearl Harbor the Coast Guard became an integral part of the Mavy and its cryptanalytic unit was moved to the Mavy Communications Annex (Nebraska Avenue). This unit was kept intact and worked upon Clandestine traffic, largely that of German secret agents sent to or from the Western Hemisphere. Soon after V-J Day, this unit did not go back to the Coast Guard but was demobilized. Currently, the Coast Guard conducts no cryptanalytic activities, the Mavy having assumed responsibility for such as might be requested by the Coast Guard. I do not believe that any such requests have been made to date.

4. I hope this history, poor as it is, will be useful to you and accept full responsibility for any errors and omissions, all of which are, of course, whintentional.
